In late September our RIC core team met for the first time in a few months to talk about where we were in our process of preparing the congregation to vote on the decision to become a Reconciling in Christ* congregation. As I prepped the agenda for the meeting I looked back over notes from the prior year's work, noting the learning forums that we had not yet scheduled, and the "stages" left in the process according to the resources we have been working from. I felt good about our progress, and considered that we had a clear path forward in terms of what to plan so that our congregation could be "ready" to take a vote on this important part of our public witness.

When the team met with our coach, I was challenged to re-think my assumptions about the work that we had left to do. I had been working from an assumption that we needed to do *all the things* before we could call for a vote. It's not that I worried we needed to do more to convince people that this in the direction God's Spirit is leading our congregation. We all agreed that the vast majority of our congregation is supportive of this step. I just wanted to make sure we were ready...that we had done all of the education we needed to do so that we could offer the kind of welcome that feels truly welcoming to groups who have too often been excluded and hurt by Christian churches. I wanted to do the more in-depth Bible study to address the clobber verses. I wanted to help everyone get comfortable with the acronyms and SOGI spectrum. I wanted to explore the ways that inclusive language could enrich our worship. I wanted to make sure we had done all of the prep work first.

But our conversation as a core team helped me to realize that this desire for "perfect" welcome might actually be contradicting the welcome we want to offer. For one thing, we don't expect "perfection" from anyone walking in the door (or those already inside), so we don't want to communicate that we must achieve a certain standard of knowledge about inclusion before we are willing to offer it. For another thing, waiting to make this public affirmation of our commitment to inclusive welcome makes it seem

like this affirmation is an optional add-on to our public witness. Whereas, the biggest reason to move forward with this decision is because it is essential to our witness about the open and embracing love of God. Finally, it has always been a given that our learning will not magically be complete once we take the vote, so we can keep offering learning opportunities after we take this step as a congregation.

The result of our core team meeting, as affirmed by Council, is that we will hold a special congregational meeting on October 30 to vote on becoming an RIC church. The article isn’t about the logistics of that vote, however. It is about the learning I am continuing to do about what “welcome” really means. I am continuing to learn that a big part of welcome is really the openness to admit to not knowing everything. If, as I hope, our congregation votes to become RIC, it will be a huge and important step in our witness to the gospel of Jesus Christ and our outreach to our community. But it will not be the end of our welcome journey. It will just be a step, a step that opens up new chances to learn and to discover what welcome really looks like.

I’m looking forward to learning and welcoming with you.

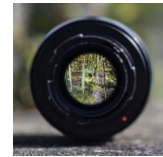
Why Do I Give?

Fall Studies

We are going to be trying a new approach to our mid-week faith-building opportunities this fall. Rather than holding an on-going Bible study, we will be switching between three different ways of engaging the questions and practices of our faith that we hope you will find engaging and helpful. The scheduling is only set through October, but here is a preview of what will be offered:

- **Balcony Conversations (Oct 12, Nov ?)** It's been a while since we gathered for one of these conversations, so we are bringing them back. If you are new to the congregation, or want a refresher, here is a short video about what these conversations involve: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=INKUGvVFYXg>. Heather Nilsen has volunteered to lead our first conversation in October. Reach out to Pastor Serena if you have an idea for the balcony in November!
- **Pop-up prayer evenings (Oct 19, Nov?).** On these nights Pastor Serena will be at the church with prayer-related resources. There will not be a structured service, but people are invited to come by to spend time in individual prayer, pray with Pastor, or use one or more of the contemplative/prayer resources provided.
- **“Ask the pastor” improv nights (Oct 26, Nov?)** On the Sunday after Christmas in 2021, Pastor Serena did a “grab bag sermon”, responding on-the-spot to questions submitted by people in the congregation. We will be adapting that format for a few evening gatherings this fall. Rather than having to submit questions ahead of time, you can bring one of two things to these sessions:
 - a faith related question (anything you have wondered about, or what to foster conversation about); or
 - an object (challenge Pastor Serena to find a way to connect the object your brought to some faith-related idea).

While Pastor Serena will engage all questions & objects, others are welcomed to join in the conversation as well. Think of it as an out-of-the-box way to practice connecting faith to our daily lives.
