From the Pastor

You Have a Vocation or - Probably - Many

Back in the 1500's, when God was working through Martin Luther to radically transform the church, the idea of vocation was a restricted category of spiritual occupations, like priests or nuns. Luther objected to this limit on the understanding of how God calls humanity to be part of God's work in the world. He argued instead for an understanding of vocation to include *anything* that *anyone* does that accomplishes good in the world or for our neighbor.

Which means that, according to Luther, regardless of what you do for a profession, you have a vocation - probably many. This is a really important idea in terms of what it means for us to be people of faith. It means that our faith is not just about the beliefs we hold, or the activities that we engage in that are explicitly spiritual. In this understanding, there is no line of demarcation between our "spiritual lives" and our "secular lives." Everything that we do has the potential to be something that we do for God, whether that be prayer and service, or taking our dog for a walk or making dinner for a loved one. We always have the potential to be going about our daily lives for the glory of God and the good of those around us. This is the broadest possible understanding of Christian vocation.

There is an in-between understanding of vocation, however, that can also be worth exploring. This understanding recognizes that we each have particular gifts and interests that equip us in unique ways. While anything we do can be done vocationally, there are particular things that might be our particular vocations... ways that we are set apart to serve. These vocations can relate to our professions, or else to hobbies or special interests. They are the things we have devoted time and energy to that we then have the potential to share with others in meaningful ways.
