The Opposite of Gratitude

In November it's traditional to reflect on the topic of giving thanks or nurturing an "attitude of gratitude." It's certainly a positive and worthwhile topic. I have worked to nurture various gratitude practices in my own life and family over the years, and I whole-heartedly encourage such efforts. A bit more gratitude on a grand scale could make a huge difference in the world!

This year, however, I have a new insight about the way that gratitude works in my own mind and heart, or – rather – an insight about the instincts and unconscious habits that work AGAINST operating from a place of gratitude on a daily basis. As part of a leadership development program I am participating in this year, we were coached in identifying the barriers to behaviors that we want to practice but that we struggle to maintain. Gratitude is a behavior that I want to make more central to the way I live my life, but I recognize that it's something I struggle to do. When asked how I'm doing, my mind automatically jumps to problems rather than blessings (even if I stop my mouth from confessing that first thought). When I plan out my week, I tend to ruminate on the list of tasks and sources of stress rather than recognizing the wonderful things that are part of my daily life. In short, thankfulness is something I have to coach myself into; it's not my first instinct.

As I have explored the reasons behind this, it has become clear to me that the root cause is anxiety. I have lived most of my life with an anxiety disorder (although it was only diagnosed a few years ago), and anxiety is my instinctual way of functioning. It tells me that I need to always be on alert for what might go wrong, so that I can be prepared. If I hold onto a constant edge of worry – so my mind tells me – I will never be taken off-guard or be left helpless in the face of a disaster, because I will always have a plan. The problem with this way of moving through life is that it locks me in a defensive position and effectively cuts off gratitude. Of course, my therapist is quick to remind me that defense mechanisms have a function. There are plenty of contexts

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in which we do need to be alert for potential dangers, or at least engaged in thinking through our options and actions. We should not be too quick to judge ourselves for operating from a place of anxiety when the world requires some real vigilance to navigate. But the world is also a place that offers us daily gifts: opportunities to see beauty, or offer love, or experience joy.

So, this November, I'm not setting a general goal of practicing more gratitude. Rather, I'm aiming to keep my eyes open. Sometimes that will mean being aware of the kinds of things that my anxiety constantly scans for... and not judging myself for that habit. But sometimes that will mean seeing the reason for gratitude and letting them balance out the anxiety. This way, I'm not just trying to manufacture artificial gratitude. I'm opening myself up to all the true reasons I have to be grateful.

# Ministry Focus: Balcony Conversations

Balcony conversations are a chance to step back and reflect. The leader for a particular session chooses a bible verse, hymn, devotion, poem, picture or anything that resonated with them to share with the group. Then they ask a question and invite the other people present to share their own experiences and reflections. The question can be very specific to the text shared or a general, "where do you think God is leading us?"

Balcony conversations are not Bible studies. The leader doesn't need to be a Biblical scholar teaching the group about their chosen text. There doesn't need to be one big answer they are leading the group towards.

These conversations are a chance for us to share with each other, to put aside the constant busyness of doing and explore together the deeper questions.

I led the most recent session in October and shared one of my Mom's favorite hymns, "Earth and All Stars," a beautiful celebration of God's wonder in ordinary, everyday things. I then asked the group where they have found the wonder of God in unlikely or ordinary places which led to a lovely and affirming conversation.

By having different members of our congregation take turns leading balcony conversations, we get to benefit from the multitude of voices we have at Abiding Peace. So I extend an invitation to all in the Abiding Peace community to volunteer and start a conversation.
