Keeping Christmas in Our Hearts

This past December, we have again heard the annual call to Keep Christ in Christmas. This call is a relevant challenge to the societal forces that define the practices of Cultural Christmas. The cultural side of the holiday includes much that is beautiful: an abundance of lights in the long dark of winter nights; reminders about the joy of giving; and the opportunity to focus attention on valuing our loved ones. Not to mention, who can deny the goodness of Christmas cookies!?

But cultural Christmas has its dangers as well. Without the grounding in the Christ story, the warm fuzzy feelings of the Christmas season can drift into vague sentimentality that is more about feeling good than recognizing the power of self-sacrificing love. And, of course, there is the rampant consumerism of Black Friday deals and the competitive side of holiday displays. Cultural Christmas can produce as much stress as joy, and as much friction as togetherness.

So, the call to keep Christ in Christmas is a helpful reminder that there is something more important than presents and ornaments and holiday baking at the heart of the Christmas season. None of those things are bad, but we must not let them distract our attention from the powerful truth of Emmanuel, God with Us. The most important thing we celebrate is the Love that chose fragility and struggle in order to join us in our messy lives and show us that God will do anything to be with us. That is the message at the heart of Christmas. And it is a message that will change us if we let it. Because once we know how wildly, and deeply, and completely we are loved... how can we live lives controlled by fear, or selfishness, or distrust again?
