MESSY METAPHOR

As many of you know, I did not grow up in a liturgical church tradition, so much of the traditional imagery associated with church seasons was something I got to discover once I found the Lutheran church. I must also admit, however, that I did not always really pay much attention to it. It was the Lutheran theology that pulled me into this branch of Christ's church much more than the forms and depth of the worship. It took until I was responsible for actually planning the flow and content of the liturgy for me to really appreciate the significance and intention behind so many of the things that add layers of meaning to our worship.

I remember during my first Easter season at Abiding Peace seeing the banners and altar paraments for the first time, decorated with beautiful butterflies, and just thinking, "Oh, that's pretty. I guess that's sort of a spring image." It wasn't until I mentioned them to Mary and she replied that butterflies were a traditional image for Easter because of the association of new life coming from the grave that I put the pieces together. We don't have butterflies on our Easter linens because they are "pretty." They are a powerful symbol of resurrection. The flightless caterpillar must be enclosed in its cocoon tomb and die to its former life in order to emerge as a butterfly.

The metaphor is a powerful one... but it's definitely not pretty. Not if you know anything about what happens during the metamorphosis. Without getting into the gooey details (and they are gooey), the caterpillar essentially has to dissolve so that all of the building blocks of its physical body can be reorganized from one configuration to another. The result can be breathtakingly beautiful, and the ephemeral nature of that beauty can create an illusion of fragility, but the process to get there is born out of the enormous strength required to let go of what is known in order to allow for transformation.

As our congregation is facing a tremendous task of transformation this year, I deeply appreciate this Easter metaphor. Not because of its beauty but because of its messiness. There is a comfort in the reminder that change usually involves taking things about before they can be put back together. And there is encouragement in the truth that sometimes what looks like fragility is really courageous strength. This is the heart of the story we find in the empty tomb. The evidence that new life comes through the death of what came before, and even though the process can be very messy, the result is worth
