Usually, when we hear the phrase "what are you waiting for?" it is meant as a goad into action. The implication is: if you can name what you want to happen, then you should get moving to make it happen! Waiting, in this context, is the enemy. It is the barrier to realizing our dreams. It may even be a subtle call-out, suggesting that we are too scared or indecisive to take control of our own lives.

But if Advent is a season for waiting, and if that season lasts 4 weeks, then the question takes on a different implication. In the context of Advent, waiting is not something that we are pushed to get past or to rush through. Rather, it is a discipline. It is an intentional cultivation of stillness and a willingness to anticipate God's action, rather than just taking action into our own hands. This waiting is not passive, however. It is a waiting of preparation. It calls us into the work of opening our hearts and minds and lives to an agenda that is NOT about our ideas and wants and actions, but rather about God's incarnation: God's self-revelation in a form or a manner that we do not get to dictate.

In Advent, we can hear "what are you waiting for?" as a very different challenge than a call to take action. In this season, our task not to rush into action, but rather to take seriously the contemplation of what we are expecting God to do. Advent is a call to remember that God is NOT a divine Santa Claus, and Christmas is not about get everything on our list. We have something much better than presents to anticipate. We are waiting for God's inbreaking work of *holy disruption*, for the revelation of how God wants to interrupt and remake things that are not right with the world. If we trust God, we can trust that these holy disruptions will be good, but there's a reason why we wait for them. We need these Advent season to prepare ourselves to welcome God's plans rather than our own.

So, this Advent, I encourage us all to think about what we are waiting for, and to ask God for the grace to anticipate God's will, not ours, being done. ~ *Pastor Serena*

Long-term Planning

At November's Council meeting, we were having a conversation about how to address the leak in the church utility closet, and one of the Council members asked "isn't the roof new?" It was an understandable question. We did a big capital campaign several years ago to repair the leaking roof, so it's concerning to hear about another leak. As it happens, the leak is in a different part of the building, so it's not a problem with the new roof (which covers the sanctuary), but it highlights one of the challenges of owning a building: *buildings regularly need repairs*. In addition to the current leak, there is the annual issue with air conditioning (or rather, its lack), and the church parking lot is definitely going downhill. And jumping from facilities crisis to crisis can be exhausting.

So, Council has decided to take a more intentional approach. On January 19 (at 7:00pm), we will be holding a Long-Range Planning meeting for anyone interested and available to do some outside-the-box thinking. Coming to the meeting is not a commitment to serving on a long-term committee. It's just a chance to put our heads together about how to steward all of our responsibilities well. Please consider if you can offer creativity or ideas to the planning.
