THE "SO THAT" OF OUR MISSION

At our Retreat in July, the church Council explored 1 Philippians 1: 3-11, with particular attention to Paul's claim that he prays for the church "so that you will be able to discern what really matters...". Prayer does not need a particular agenda, of course, but it can be instructive at a more general level to ask ourselves the "so that" of our activities as a community of faith. What do we hope to achieve? What transformation or impact are we working for? When we pray, and worship, and learn, and serve, and welcome, and give... what is our 'so that'?

As part of this exploration, we went through a discernment process about what potential impacts we associate with the five ministry areas highlighted in our congregational mission statement. First writing our own descriptions of what we hope these ministries might create, and then combining our individual efforts into summary "so that" statements. The result of that process is copied here:

The congregation of Abiding Peace commits to the mission of...

Making Christ Known so that knowledge/ understanding of the real Jesus can spread widely, because that creates better places marked by love, comfort, and never being alone.

Welcoming All People so that we can fulfill Jesus' vision of the church body, that creates a diverse family who love one another, heal, bless, show grace, build friendships, and enrich us and others.

Creating a Supportive and Accepting Place so that every person (created by God), regardless of past experiences, can find peace, accept help, feel welcomed and heard, feel safe, find the courage to take risks, and be empowered to fulfill their Godcreated potential.

Growing in Faith so that we can be changed - finding hope, learning, being encouraged, and seeing things from God's perspective - and so that we can share God's love, offer support and inspiration, and make the difference Jesus wants us to.

Serving God and Our Neighbors so that Love can be an action providing support to the needs around us, opposing fear and ignorance, facilitating change to advance difference-making solutions, and remind us that we are servants of God's work.

These collaborative statements paint a powerful picture about what we are called together to do and to be as Christ's body in Budd Lake, but they are not comprehensive. I encourage you to do your own thinking about our mission as a congregation, and the "so that" motivations that guide your involvement in our ministry. What more can we do together?

NOTES FROM COUNCIL

In July, our Council met for Retreat rather than a regular business meeting, so there are no Council updates to share, but the Congregation did make the following decisions at the Congregation Meeting

Constitution:

• Updates were approved to bring the Congregational Constitution into conformity with the Model Constitution for Congregations of the ELCA. The updated constitution has been forwarded to the Synod Secretary for review and will be posted to the church website once final approval is indicated.

Budget:

 Half-yearly giving statements, combined with reminders of pledge amounts, will be sent to the congregation, with the request that any changes in giving targets be communicated to Council for budget adjustments.

Partnership Project:

- All Phase 2 giving to the Thrive Campaign was designated to be used for two purposes:
 - Expenses related to Property Management/Agent fees for finding regular partners to use available space in the building, and
 - Necessary repairs to the building
