Over the next two months you'll be hearing more than usual about our church finances. In part that is due to the season (October-November is "stewardship time" in the church world), and in part it is due to some hard realities about the congregation's current financial situation. We always have these conversations first at the Council - to think and pray together about how to approach the budgetary side of leading the congregation into a new year of ministry - and I will admit that I was feeling a little bit anxious going into the September meeting, knowing this topic was on the agenda.

And then... it turned out to be one of the most inspiring Council meetings we have had in a long time. We talked about all the hard things - the monthly budget shortfall, the long-term capital needs of the building, the drop in membership - but the context of the conversation was not about anxiety and handwringing. It was about what God is calling us to do and to be as God's church in this time and place. Because that calling is what lies at the center of our identity as Abiding Peace. We believe that we have been called together as a community of faith to actually have an impact. We exist to grow faith, and to practice love for God and our neighbor, and to make a real difference in the lives of people both inside and outside our congregation. Making decisions about our budget and our building are a necessary part of equipping that mission, but they are not the central thing. They are just a part of the means. The central thing is discerning how God is calling our congregation to minister in this particular time and place, and then committing to do that.

The financial challenges the congregation is facing are giving us the chance to **ask the big questions about our mission**, the questions that are easier to ignore when everything is stable and we can just keep going along the way that we always have. On November 19, the Council will be leading a special

congregational meeting to explore three different visions of where God is leading us in terms of the shape of our congregational ministry. We will explore what it would look like to make more significant budget cuts to maintain our current model of ministry; what it might look like to leverage our building as a shared-space resource for the larger community; and what it might look like to sell the building to shift our ministry model more substantially. Even listing out these different exploratory options in a newsletter article will, I expect, raise some big emotions and concerns in the congregation, but I want to encourage you to genuinely see this as an opportunity. When we are comfortable, it's easy to get complacent and to avoid curiosity about what God is up to among us. Right now, we have the chance to explore and discern together. And that is the plan. To explore these questions together. To do this discernment as a community - with thoughtful leadership from the Council, but with the full participation of the congregation.

Each week we pray to God in worship: "thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven." This prayer is a central part of who we are as church: we are people who are defined by our participation in God's work in the world. There are lots of different ways that work can happen, and as long as we listen for God's leading, we will nurture the kind of ministry mindset that will continue to nurture our community.


